|                    | to lay<br>meaning: put something down   | to lie<br>meaning: to recline  |
|--------------------|---|--|
| present tense      | lay or lays <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>When Ben and Cheri come in, they <u>lay</u> their keys on the table.</li><li>When he comes in, Ben <u>lays</u> his keys on the table.</li></ul> | lie or lies <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Cheri and Ben <u>lie</u> on the couch.</li><li>Cheri <u>lies</u> on the couch.</li></ul> |
| past tense         | laid <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Yesterday, I <u>laid</u> my keys on the table.</li></ul>   | lay <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Yesterday, Cheri <u>lay</u> on the couch.</li></ul>  |
| present participle | laying <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Bob is <u>laying</u> his keys on the table.</li></ul>  | lying <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Cheri is <u>lying</u> on the couch.</li></ul>  |
| past participle    | laid <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Yesterday, I had <u>laid</u> my keys on the table.</li></ul>   | lain <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Cheri had <u>lain</u> on the couch all day.</li></ul>   |
