Singular and Plural Possessive Nouns

A noun that shows ownership is a **possessive noun**.

To turn a *singular noun* into a **possessive noun**, add an **apostrophe (')** and an **- s**.

example: The boy's wagon is in the garage.

To turn a *plural noun* that ends in *-s* into a **possessive noun** add an **apostrophe (')** after the *-s*.

example: The farmer painted horses' stables.

To turn a *plural noun* that does not end in *-s* into a **possessive noun** add an **apostrophe (')** and an **- s**.

example: The women's hats were beautiful.
