A noun that shows ownership is a **possessive noun**.

To turn a singular noun into a possessive noun, add an apostrophe (') and an - s.

example: The boy's wagon is in the garage.

To turn a *plural noun* that *ends in -s* into a **possessive noun** add an **apostrophe (')** after the -s.

example: The farmer painted <u>horses'</u> stables.

To turn a plural noun that does not end in -s into a possessive noun add an apostrophe (') and an -s.

example: The <u>women's</u> hats were beautiful.
