The word *I* is used in the subject of a sentence. The word *m*e is used in the predicate of the sentence.

examples: Kim and I walked to the deli.

The pronoun *I* is used because it falls in the subject of the sentence.

Kim went to the deli with me.

The pronoun *me* is used because it falls in the predicate of the sentence.
